Problems accessing your Local Government Pension?

For some time, Sandwell UNISON has been aware that members retiring are waiting unacceptably long times before receiving their local government pension from West Midlands Pension Fund. We have been made aware of some staff waiting 6 months before receiving their pension.

Sandwell UNISON has raised this through our regional structures, including to UNISON's representative on the West Midlands Pension Fund Board. We have also raised this with employers of the fund, who are also concerned, and requested Sandwell MBC and the trade unions raise their joint concerns.

The delays are due to the introduction of a new computer system not working. Despite the Fund continually saying things are improving, the evidence suggests not.

What is the NJC?

The NJC is the body where the trade unions meet with employer representatives to negotiate on pay, holiday entitlement, and sick pay (and other terms and conditions) for local government and school support staff.

The **NJC** is made up of **31 UNISON** representatives, **16 GMB** and **11 UNITE** which gives UNISON members the majority voice.

No other trade unions are recognised to negotiate with the employer on your pay rises. The NEU is **NOT** a recognised trade union for negotiating NJC pay. It has no votes nor voice on the NJC.
